CHEMISTRY 112: LAB POLICIES

Course Requirements

You will need to show up in lab and check-in to your locker latest by the **third week of classes** to receive a grade for this course.

You will be completing 12 lab experiments (see schedule) during the semester. To pass this course, you will need to successfully complete 10 out of 12 experiments excluding check-in and check-out. Please note that checking-out of your locker is also required to pass this course (with a passing grade).

Policies regarding missed laboratory periods

Many Chem. 112 lab sections are completely full. Also, the reagents used for a given experiment and the waste generated by that experiment must be cleared promptly from the lab. Due to above reasons, there will **be no make-up labs for this course**. If you know in advance that you have to miss a particular lab period (e.g. school related field trip), **inform your Instructor in writing** in advance. If the Instructor agrees that your reason is valid, he/she will arrange for make-up work during the week that the experiment is scheduled.

If you have an unscheduled absence due to <u>illness or emergency</u>, please ask a friend or relative to contact the Instructor, Lab Coordinator or the Chemistry department by **phone or e-mail before your lab**. If you wait until your lab is over to inform your instructor, it will be too late. If you are unable to make up the missed work and you have a valid reason, your instructor may decide to excuse your absence and give you an average of your lab scores for the missed experiment. In any event, you will have missed a pre-lab quiz, which cannot be made up.

We will allow only one make-up lab per student per semester. Please remember that this make-up policy is only for those with a valid excuse and with Instructor's approval.

If the conditions for an excused absence or for making up missed work cannot be met, and you have several absences you will have to drop the course. If it is too late to drop, you may receive an incomplete provided you have completed a minimum of five consecutive experiments. All other missed work will result in zeros and will affect your final grade in Chem. 112.

Bereavement
