Pre-conference workshops will take place at the Bloomington-Normal Marriott Hotel & Conference Center. All conference sessions will take place at Illinois State University at the Bone Student Center. Plenary sessions will also be live streamed on a virtual platform.

Target Audience

This conference will address a variety of topics on advancing the health and well-being of minority and underserved populations in Illinois. The target audience includes public health personnel and staff, college and university students, public and private sector health professionals, nurses, health educators, licensed social workers/licensed clinical social workers, professional counselors/licensed clinical counselors, dietitians, peer educators/health navigators, and community & faith-based organizations.

The Minority Health Conference is designed to:

- Improve knowledge on health disparities and social justice issues and how they affect health outcomes.
- Build competencies among healthcare professionals and develop collaboration with other service providers and community partners in serving minorities and other disadvantaged communities in Illinois.
- Improve the health and well-being of Illinois' racial and ethnic minority populations through the development of health policies and culturally linguistically appropriate programs that will eliminate health disparities.
- Build on community engagement and collaboration and to work with these communities to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate services through scientific and evidence-based best practices.
